The Winterborne Valley & Milton Abbas

Do you ever have a funny old week? It has been a bit like that in my life.

I have written all my Christmas Cards and the Round Robin to go inside them. Why so early? Well I felt I needed to send my cards early this year in an attempt to pre-empt receiving too many addressed to John and Sue. But signing them just Sue feels very odd. I wonder how folks will identify me. Will they wonder who this person called Sue is? Then I wrapped quite a few Christmas Presents and found myself just having to write "with love from Sue, or Mum, or Granny. It all added to a sense of being half a person somehow.

In our Gospel this Sunday Pilate is asking Jesus who he is, and Jesus gives an answer with a question. This Sunday is the last day of the church year and called "Christ the King" Sunday. The church year starts four Sundays before Christmas. It was in the exchange between Pilate and Jesus that the contrast between the two leaders, and their two kingdoms, became clear. Jesus was direct and transparent saying that his kingdom was not of this world. He said that his subjects were those who recognized truth. So, his kingdom was not over a piece of land, rather it was over the hearts and minds of those who were brave enough to follow him. If his kingdom was like Pilate's, his followers would have been waging war — and many of Jesus' followers wanted to wage war, expecting the Messiah to lead that war — to drive the Roman occupiers out of their country. Many were disappointed that Jesus didn't start an uprising, that he wasn't a revolutionary, that the movement had prompted many people to follow him but wouldn't bring a change of government. This is the truth Jesus mentioned at the end of his conversation before Pilate, to which Pilate famously asked, "What is truth?" But then Pilate left Jesus and reported to the Jewish authorities, "I find no case against him." Pilate was not threatened by Jesus who claimed his kingdom was not of this world.

This Sunday is also by tradition the day when we should make our Christmas puddings. The tradition dates back to Victorian times when the family would gather five weeks before Christmas to stir the Christmas pudding.

As I write this, I am looking forward to seeing my oldest Grandchild this weekend as she arrives from Australia with her partner for a visit. Now I wonder what name should I suggest he calls me?

Blessings to you all as we end the Church Year and look forward to the New.
